

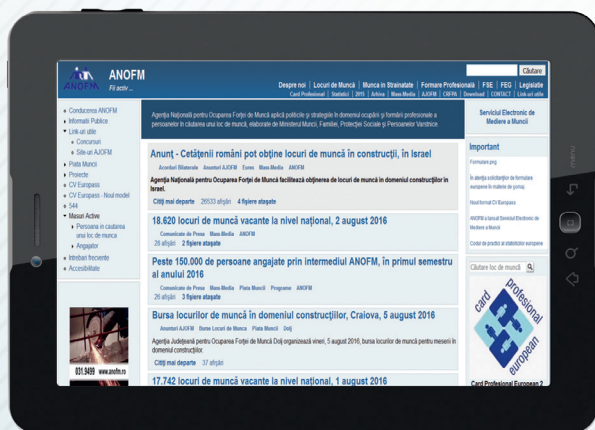
## What does the NAE / EURES offer on-line in Romania?

## About EURES

**EURES** is a cooperation network between employment services and other local, national and international organisations operating within the employment sector (trade unions, employers' associations, private employment services). EURES was established by the European Commission to support free movement of workers within the European Economic Area (EEA)<sup>1</sup>.

At EU level, the network is composed of: the European Coordination Office, the National Coordination Offices, EURES members and partners.

In Romania, the National Agency for Employment (NAE) represents the National Coordination Office, while the EURES members are the county public employment agencies – structures of NAE.

We provide **international employment services** and basic information **about living and working conditions in EEA**.

## Why EURES?

It provides **free of charge**:

- ▶ basic information concerning the EURES portal, including the job applications and CV database and the EURES network
- ▶ assistance on how to look for a job in Romania, how to create an application
- ▶ general information on living and working conditions in Romania and in EEA countries.



## How to find a job in Romania?

Before coming to Romania start looking for a job while you are in your own country. An EU/EEA or Swiss citizen you have free access to the Romanian labour market and you can be employed in the same conditions as Romanian nationals. If you are a non EU citizen, you must firstly find a Romanian employer. If he decides to employ you, he shall obtain a work permit for you. The employer shall obtain the work permit from the territorial units of the General Inspectorate for Immigration (<http://www.igi.mai.gov.ro/>) To this end, he shall submit a series of documents.

There are many opportunities to find a job:

### Labour offices

The EURES advisers can assist you when you are looking for offers, declared by Romanian employers, to the territorial structures of NAE. The job vacancies are available also on NAE's database **[www.anofm.ro](http://www.anofm.ro)**, bookmark ***Locuri de muncă*** and on the European Job Mobility Portal **[www.eures.europa.eu](http://www.eures.europa.eu)**, bookmark ***Jobseekers / Search for a job***.

### Private employment agencies

Registered Romanian private employment agencies can be found on the websites of the territorial structures of Labour Inspection ([www.inspectiamuncii.ro](http://www.inspectiamuncii.ro))

## What does EURES offer on-line?

One of the most frequently visited European Commission websites - the European Job Mobility Portal **[www.eures.europa.eu](http://www.eures.europa.eu)** is at your disposal.



### On portal you will:

- ▶▶ find up-to-date job offers of Romanian employers announced by the local public employment offices,
- ▶▶ add your CV to the database, which registered as well employers from Romania and all Europe have access to,
- ▶▶ open "My EURES" account that will match available on the website information to your individual needs, i.e.: you will get a notification of up-to-date job offers corresponding with your CV,
- ▶▶ find detailed information on living and working conditions in Romania in Romanian, English, German and French.
